This task force is currently involved in the following volunteer activities:

- Programs that serve inmates in the Monroe County Jail including the Read to Me program, and volunteer participation in offerings such as AA, NA, and support activities that involve individuals and groups.
- Assist the local non-profits, Courage to Change and New Leaf New Life, tutor those pursuing a high school degree or preparing for college.
- A new program entitled KIDS WITH ABSENT PARENTS (KAP) is underway that reaches out to children of incarcerated parents. Girls Inc and Big Brothers Big Sisters are serving as partners in this program that will

 of incarceration and issues related to it by organizing forums, movie
